To prepare for our next show and upgrade our displays, precut Plexiglas has been purchased for both the S and O gauge modular layouts. The S gauge committee is improving the track bed with formed rubber ballast. Club members might consider running their own train equipment on the G, HO, or O gauge layouts. You can start to put your equipment in working order by cleaning and lubricating the engine or cars respectively.
