A VIEW FROM THE CAB

We are back from Florida, and I am a bit sorry to have to return to the bitter cold that January has given us. After returning to the club, two maintenance items have crept up: a faulty light fixture over the front door that illuminates the parking lot, and a very strange cracking of ceramic tiles on the floor of our main sales room. There is about 12 sq. ft. of cracked 12" x 12" tiles, and we have also noticed a small "heaving" of several tiles in the smaller sales room. Removing several of the worst cracked tiles showed no issue whatsoever to the concrete floor below. We have bought a replacement light fixture for the front door, and I have purchased products to replace the broken tiles. They will not match, but the flooring here is 30 years old, and most tile stores don't carry any 12" x 12" tiles.

We have buyers for two of the recently built layouts; the HO layout built in the fall of 2024, and the John Deere layout built this past November. Both are awaiting pickup. Since we have previously sold the 8' x 12' S-gauge display, which was picked up last December, we are now down to our former configuration in the museum except for the 5' x 8' HO display built last November.

At one point we had thought we would bring the 16' HO and the traveling Thomas layouts to Seaford for the show on February 28th, so due to those layouts being sold, we need to discuss changing back to the traveling O-gauge layout, the display that we usually take to that event.

E-Bay sales continue to go very well, in fact the 16' HO layout that I mentioned before was sold to someone in South Carolina through E-Bay. That buyer will be coming up to collect it in 2 weeks. Thanks to Samantha Bianca for her excellent work on E-bay listings, and to Mike B. and Chris for their help in packing and shipping items.

We will have a lot to cover in our February 11th meeting. We will discuss the budget for 2026, as submitted by Bob Schadewald, and the idea of Members-only nights on one or two Wednesdays per month. We will also be voting for two positions on the board. We also will discuss the Ocean City events and our ongoing commitment to them.

We have learned that the sale of the property we lease for our museum is now complete, and we have reached out to the new owner to ask for a meeting in March or April to set forth a new lease agreement, and to determine their intentions for our building or a possible move.

Keep warm and stay safe during this particularly frigid time.

The Leslie Brothers acquired his patent and produced a successful prototype in 1883 and went on to establish the Rotary Steam Shovel Mfg. Co. in Paterson, NJ. Lionel has offered various versions of the popular rotary snowplow model since 1957.
