

Doc Dougherty also has numerous excess club items on sale on E-Bay, and if you search for HO Marklin you should find the items.


I certainly hope everyone has been keeping safe and hopefully we will see the outlook for the rest of the year improve as we near the summer months ahead.

DIRECTIONS FOR "O/S" GAUGE

- 1. Cut 1/4" dowel six inches long
- 2. Drill four holes on each side 1/2" apart, about half way through the dowel. Start on one side 3" down from the top and start the other side 3/14" down from top. If you don't have a small drill bit, cut the head off one of the brads and use it as a drill bit.
- 3. Cut a piece of wood for the crosspiece 3/16" X 1/4" X 2 1/2"
- Cut two pieces of wood for the braces 3/32" X 3/16" X 1". Cut a 45 degree angle on the ends of each piece.
- Stain the cross piece, braces, and pole and let dry.
- 6.Cut 8 pieces of 19 ga wire 3/8" long. Bend one end to a 90 degree angle. Insert them into the pole. You may need glue.
- Feed two beads onto a brad and nail it to the end of the cross piece. Repeat on other end. Be sure to leave a small space between the beads.
- 8. Center the cross piece and nail it 1" from the top of the pole.
- Glue the two small pieces to the pole and cross piece as shown.
- 10. Cut a 1/4" dowel, one inch long and drill a 1/16" hole about 1/4" from top. Paint the dowel gray. When dry, glue it to the pole below and on the opposite side of the cross piece
- 11.Cut a 4" piece of thin brass wire. Push it through the hole in the transformer (gray dowel) and wrap it around the nails in the cross piece between the beads. Cut off excess wire.
- 12. Drill 1/4" hole in platform and glue in place. Place poles about 12" apart
